What is PBIS?

Dr. N.E. Roberts Elementary is a PBIS school. PBIS stands for **P**ositive **B**ehavior **I**ntervention and **S**upports. This means that we are working to build an environment in which positive behavior will always be more effective for students than problem behavior. This system emphasizes prevention, teaching, and reinforcement strategies to achieve meaningful behavioral and lifestyle outcomes. We utilize CHAMPS as our PBIS.

C - What level conversation should be used for an activity?
H - Who and how do you ask for help?
A - What should you do during the activity?
M - What kind of movement is allowed or expected?
P - What kind of participation is expected for the activity?
S - Success for all!

CHAMPS at Dr. N.E. Roberts

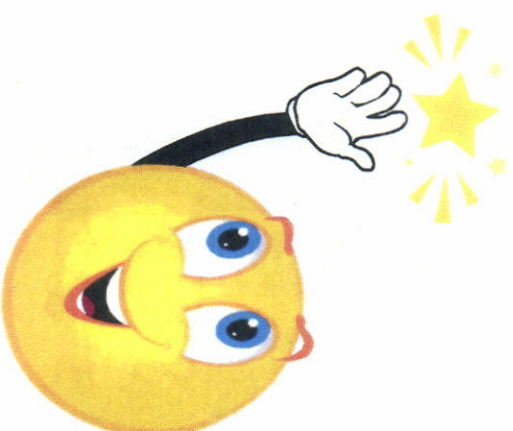
Every day, students will have an opportunity to earn points by following CHAMPS and being the best ROCKET they can, by **R**especting others and themselves, **O**wning their learning, **C**ommunicating positively, being **K**ind to others, trying to do **E**xtraordinary work, and always being **T**ruthful. Each month, theme will be a school-wide CHAMPS reward. In order to participate in the school-wide CHAMPS reward, a student must accumulate the pre-determined amount of points for the month. Some months will vary according to the amount of days off.

Some rewards include:

- Hat day
- Fancy dress up day
- Costume or crazy hair day
- Jersey or team shirt day
- Dress like a teacher day

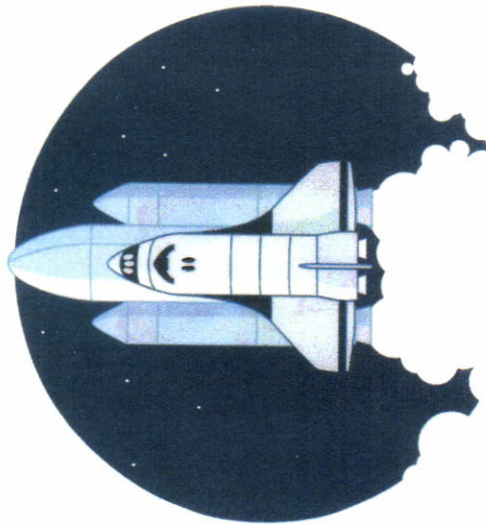
We expect this ROCKET and CHAMPS behavior not only in the classroom, but also in the hallways, art, music, P.E., lunch, and even on the bus.

1. Behaviors are pre-requisites for academics.

3. Repetition is key to learning new skills.
 - For a child to learn something new, it needs to be repeated on average 8 times.
 - For a child to unlearn an old behavior and replace it with a new behavior, the new behavior must be repeated on average 28 times.
